The Danger Signs

- Tensed body
- Stiff tail
- Pulled back ears
- Backing away
- Growling
- Snapping
- Intense stare
- Raised Fur

What not to do

- Run away from dog
- Scream and shout
- Make eye contact

What to do

- Keep hands at side
- Stand very still

What to do if you are bitten

- Don't pull away from the dog
- Hold still
- If you fall, roll into a ball by tucking your arms and legs in.
- Wash wound with soap and water for 15 minutes
- Take the injured person to your closest Emergency Department for further consultation and management.
